We have trained ten volunteers in the use of strimmers/brushcutters. This will enable us to more efficiently clear public rights of way, giving better and easier public access to nature.

# The 2021 New Forest Walking & Cycling Festival

Planning for the 2021 New Forest Walking and Cycling Festival is underway. So far we have over forty guided walks and cycle rides in the schedule and aim to have over eighty. The festival dates are from the 16<sup>th</sup> of October to the 7<sup>th</sup> of November, a three-week period either side of half-term.

The festival is sponsored by Hoburne-Bashley and concentrates on teaching people about the special qualities of the National Park and how help keep it that way for future generations.

#### **England Coast Path**

We are waiting to hear from Natural England that the Calshot to Gosport section of the ECP has been determined. Once determined we can start work to add new gates, signposts and interpretation boards.

## **The New Forest Access Forum**

Current Access Forum activity has included:
