What is a National Park City?

“A large urban area that is managed and semi-protected through both formal and informal means to enhance the natural capital of its living landscape.

A defining feature is the widespread and significant commitment of residents, visitors and decision-makers to allow natural processes to provide a foundation for a better quality of life”



What if...?

- Citizens had more agency in shaping the use of public land
- Housing developments incorporated nature into the fundamental design
- Urban design considered the needs of hedgehogs, bees and butterflies
- Ethnically diverse groups had equal access to green space and could develop a sense of belonging both to place and to groups interested in nature
- Local food sovereignty was a serious priority for local authorities, Universities and businesses?



Why do we want National Park City status?

- Link between New Forest and South Downs
- Tourist destination/desirable place to live and work – green architecture, lido, green grid
- Health and wellbeing
- Combat biodiversity loss
- Living our best lives
- Community cohesion



How do we get it?

- Widespread consultation – imagine the National Park City
- Engage community groups, faith groups, business community, decision-makers
- Implement the vision – all stakeholders
- Submit portfolio to the National Park City Foundation
